CHURCH VOTER REGISTRATION

GUIDE

Helping people get registered to vote is a practical way to serve your congregation and community. Here's a simple guide to planning a successful Voter Registration Sunday at your church.

1

Choose Your Dates



Select one or two Sundays each year and add them to your church calendar in advance. Keeping the same timeframe annually helps your church build a consistent rhythm around civic engagement.

2

KNOW YOUR STATE GUIDELINES



Before the event, review your state's Secretary of State website for:

- Voter registration deadlines
- Rules for third-party registration efforts
- Whether volunteer deputies must be trained
- Online voter registration availability
- This ensures everything is done accurately and legally.

PREPARE YOUR TEAM

Recruit one or two reliable members of your congregation to serve as leaders for the effort. If your state requires official training voters, have them complete it ahead of time.

DECIDE HOW REGISTRATION WILL HAPPEN

Consider the easiest way for people to register



- Online registration (if your state offers it)
- iPads or laptops
- QR codes
- Paper handouts

Making the process simple removes barriers

SPREAD THE WORD

Build awareness ahead of time:

- Announce the event during services
- Include it in the church bulletin or newsletter
- Share reminders for several weeks leading up to the date



Also, recruit a few friendly volunteers to help welcome people at the registration table.

SET UP A VISIBLE REGISTRATION AREA

On the day of the event:



- Place a table in a high-traffic area
- Provide tablets or tabletops if using online registration
- Display clear signage
- Have printed instructions or handouts available

Make it easy to stop, ask questions, and participate.
